Need to know

Wiltshire Beekeepers Association vote to become a charity

The membership of our County's Beekeepers Association voted overwhelmingly to become a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) at a Special General Meeting (SGM) held on 8 March in Devizes Corn Exchange. While the objectives of the CIO are to advance the education of the public and beekeepers in the craft of beekeeping and to promote the importance of bees in the environment, one of the important implications for we hobby beekeepers is that we will be able to claim Gift Aid on our subscriptions which in turn will increase the income revenue in our Branch.

The next step is for the Wiltshire Beekeepers Association to apply formally for conversion to a CIO. While all the detailed hard work in creating a mandatory new Constitution and County Rules has been completed and approved by Council, the application must go to the Charity Commissioners who may take some time to grant formal approval. That said, it is hoped to achieve this by the Autumn and have the eleven trustees of the Management Board of the new organisation firmly in post.

Our Branch has been represented on the Charity Sub Committee by our President and our Chair, both of whom are more than prepared to answer any questions you might have as the application process progresses.

Secretary's Goldmine: Crop Spraying Alerts

Last autumn I found myself wondering, in an idle moment, how I could make sure that I get notified if farmers will be spraying insecticides near my apiary. After a bit of digging around, I found that the answer was that I needed to register on Bee Connected.

The UK code of practice for pesticide use requires farmers to provide notification when they intend to use certain products to protect their crops. They can comply with the notification requirement by logging on to Bee Connected and entering information about the product they intend to use, the date when they will be using it, and the location where it will be used. This information is then correlated with the location of apiaries that are entered onto the database by individual beekeepers. Beekeepers who are registered on the site and whose hives are in the vicinity of the crop spraying will then receive an e-mail to give some advance warning.

In order to receive these notifications, you will need to register on Bee Connected on https://beeconnected.org.uk and provide them with information about the location of your apiary(ies). You can set the area within which you want to receive notifications from a 1km to 5km radius of your hives. After you've done that, you're all set.
