The AGM will be followed by the Winter Lecture to be given by Beth Harris on "The Electric Ecology of Bee".

Module 5 Honey Bee Biology Study Group commenced 21st November.

24 members from across the county joined the first Module 5 session on Zoom. The aim is to use the syllabus to help those attending to increase their beekeeping knowledge and help those planning to sit the exam with their preparations. Experience suggests that some will decide it's not for them but it's hoped those who have started will stay the course There are not many reasons in our normal beekeeping experience to worry about the biology of the honey bee but having some knowledge does help explain certain aspects of honey bee behaviour. The aim is to provide fortnightly zoom meeting with a "recap" the following week. Emails give participants pointers about the content of each session so they can prepare before the sessions.
